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KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Jacquelyn Brown, Ph.D. Scientist, Research

Dr. Jacquelyn Brown manages the biomarkers and disease development grant portfolios for the Prevention Program. She is involved in JDRF's cross-disciplinary efforts surrounding type 1 diabetes (T1D) and Big Data, which involves teaming up with data analytics experts, including IBM Watson researchers, to develop machine

learning methods to analyze years of global T1D research data to identify factors leading to onset in children.

Dr. Brown also works closely with both the Regeneration and Immunotherapies programs to implement an effective JDRF Biomarker Program. The goal of this program is to identify multiple biomarkers that present before diagnosis of T1D in order to recognize the genesis of the disease at an earlier stage and prolong onset. Dr. Brown is a person with T1D herself, living with it for 20 years.



Sean Busby

Sean Busby is a professional backcountry snowboarder with T1D and lupus living off the grid in the wilds of Alaska. Sean is the first person with T1D to snowboard on all seven continents, including some of the most remote and isolated mountain ranges on the planet.

Sean is the founder and executive director of an international nonprofit, Riding On Insulin, which hosts action sports camps for kids, teens and adults living with T1D. As a long term Omnipod® Insulin Management System user, Sean truly lives an active, untethered life of adventure.
