 NYS & Federal Budgets CHAS Surveys Flu Vaccine Campaign Walk with a Doc Events 	Janine Logan reports on the status of the state and federal budgets. The state budget continues to be unbalanced, seeing cuts to healthcare, Medicaid redesign and more. The federal budget awaits a decision on a second COVID-19 relief bill. House members will not leave on the October recess until a decision is made. Here more in the meeting recording.
	Due to the lack of in-person events in recent months, the number of Community Health Assessment Survey (CHAS) that the LIHC has received has reduced drastically. The CHAS is a tool used by the LIHC to learn about the health needs of the residents on Long Island. In partnership with <u>NYSACHO</u>, the Suburban Hospital Alliance of New York State (SHANYS), which the LIHC is an initiative of, has created a campaign to increase awareness of flu vaccines, educate the public on their importance, and increase flu vaccine rates. The campaign will launch during the week of September 21st, and will cover topics including who should get a flu shot, why they're important, and how COVID-19 will affect this year's flu season. Keep your eyes out for the campaign launch, and help spread the word by sharing these public health messages.

As part of Long Island Mobility Week, the LIHC has teamed up with the New York Coalition for Transportation Safety to host two outdoor Walk with a Doc events. Both events will have a dual focus of walking to improve health and staying safe while you walk.
