Member Survey Data	update of the most recent Community Member Survey analysis. Responses from January 1,
	2017 to June 30, 2017 were compared to 2016's responses and it was discovered that result
	remained largely unchanged. Interestingly, some concerns did shift in importance. Women's
	health and wellness became a top concern, while concern has decreased for Drugs and Alcohol
	in Suffolk County. Alyssa will re-run the analysis in early 2018 and compare the full 2017
	responses to 2016.
