The training focused on presenting data in visually appealing ways and on best practices when using or creating infographics. On Friday, September 29, 2017, we will hold the event at Farmingdale State College. Laura Herman, Managing Director of FSG, will lead the event’s activities. However, the budget might change the way in which these programs are able to exist. The best approach is to continue to compliment programming mandated by DSRIP.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Data: Updated Community Member Survey Data 	<p>Alyssa Bunce, Nassau-Suffolk Hospital Council/Long Island Health Collaborative, gave an update of the most recent Community Member Survey analysis. Responses from January 1, 2017 to June 30, 2017 were compared to 2016’s responses and it was discovered that result remained largely unchanged. Interestingly, some concerns did shift in importance. Women’s health and wellness became a top concern, while concern has decreased for Drugs and Alcohol in Suffolk County. Alyssa will re-run the analysis in early 2018 and compare the full 2017 responses to 2016.</p>
