<p><b>Recap</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• North Shore Animal League Walk and Wag</li> </ul> 	<p>On <b>Saturday, September 29<sup>th</sup> in Port Washington</b>, the LIHC worked with the North Shore Animal League during their "Walk and Wag" event. As you all know, The LIHC promotes walking and saw an opportunity to partner with North Shore Animal League as a way to raise awareness about health benefits of walking to humans and secondarily to canines. This was the league's second walk and it is an established event. A partnership like this one also illustrates that health does indeed affect all</p>

	sectors and partnering with organizations outside the traditional realm of health and social services is exactly what the state calls us to do.
<b>Food Access Cluster Update</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>presented by Nancy Copperman, Northwell Health</li> </ul>	The Food Access Cluster was created during the Collective Impact event the LIHC held in September 2017. Northwell Health, Island Harvest, Eat Smart NY, Western Suffolk BOCES Creating Healthy Schools and Communities Grant, Cohen’s Children Medical Center Breast Feeding Grant (BFREE), Kohl’s Cares Keeping Kids Healthy Grant and LI Cares teamed up with Alyssa Bunce to create a logic model to illustrate the work all the organizations are doing in Wyandanch, NY. Being able to share metrics and outcome data has been beneficial to all involved.
<b>NYS Prevention Agenda Update</b>	The Public Health and Health Planning Council will issue its updated 2019 – 2024 Prevention Agenda in December of this year. Planning for the new cycle has been underway for some time and included diverse stakeholder feedback. There have been some subtle changes to the five priority areas. The refinement in priority details were instituted by workgroups and presented to the Ad Hoc Committee to Advance the Prevention Agenda. We will give another update at our next meeting, once the changes are finalized.
