



Race and ethnicity are risk markers for other underlying conditions that affect health, including socioeconomic status, access to health care, and exposure to the virus related to occupation, e.g., among frontline, essential, and critical infrastructure workers.









On December 14th, 2020, Northwell Health received its first batches of the vaccine and began vaccinating our team members. Sandra Lindsay, a critical care nurse at Long Island Jewish Medical Center, was the first person not participating in a trial to be vaccinated in the U.S.





Federal Update

- President Biden signed the \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan (ARP) into law
- ARP provides \$70 billion for vaccines, testing, and workforce needs, of which \$4 billion goes to New York State
- New York State will receive \$12.5 billion to directly fund the state government

• State Update

- One-house budget bills recently released by the Senate and Assembly restore most of the healthcare budget cuts
 contained in the governor's executive budget
- Said \$12.5B, along with new upward revenue projections offered by the state's budget department, effectively eliminates the state's current deficit and projected deficit for the upcoming fiscal year
- Budget due April 1, 2021



Vaccine News

- President Biden invoking the Defense Production Act "to expedite critical materials in vaccine production, such as equipment, machinery, and supplies."
- As of March 15, 22.5 percent of New Yorkers received at least one vaccine dose and 11.6 percent are completely vaccinated
- The distribution of vaccine is being coordinated by 10 Regional Vaccination Networks, which are each led by an anchoring organization, known as a Hub
- On Long Island the Hub is Northwell Health
- Hubs are actively meeting with hospitals, county health departments, health centers, and other stakeholders to coordinate activities to ensure the most efficient and equitable distribution of vaccine
