The CHAS is a tool used by the LIHC to learn about the health needs of the residents on Long Island. COVID-19 Vaccine Education Campaign The Suburban Hospital Alliance of New York State (SHANYS), of which the LIHC is an initiative, has created a campaign to combat COVID-19 vaccine hesitancy, educate the public on the concept of herd immunity, and increase COVID-19 vaccine rates. The campaign launched during the week of March 18th. All materials are open source and available for download. Help spread the word by sharing these public health messages.</p> <p>NYS and Federal Updates Janine Logan reported on the passing of the American Rescue Plan and the \$70B it provides for vaccines, testing, and workforce needs; of which \$4B goes to New York State. NYS will receive \$12.5B. One-house budget bills recently released by the Senate and Assembly restore most of the healthcare budget cuts contained in the governor’s executive budget.
